



## **Jus ISECENSA Method: updated legal information, accessible to all through seminars**

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The main objective of the project is to inform the population notions of law, updated legal information for each group. We intend to bring information about Rights and Duties to the elderly, adolescents, consumers, among others, so that updated information reaches those who, due to different circumstances, would not have access to them otherwise. On the other hand, using the flipped classroom own methods, we will provide students from ISECENSA Law course with experiences so that the student can combine the theoretical material covered in the classroom with practical knowledge, teaching and guiding specific groups, through presentation of seminars, ways of knowledge and guarantee of their rights and duties. Legal information is a type of useful information for the promotion of citizenship, and through it law professionals produce knowledge on which they base their analysis and make decisions that will regulate life in society. The method adopted for the research will be hypothetical-deductive and as an auxiliary method, we will work with the dialectical method in which the prioritization in the construction of knowledge will take place through the relationship among the students and with the society, where teachers and students work together, reflect and elaborate content, making learning more real and meaningful. It is expected with the proposed research the experience of an educational model that does not seek only the reorientation, with regard to the construction of knowledge, but that allows the student to experience social skills, critical and reflective actions, so that it impels him to rethink paradigms always contextualizing it with contemporary society. The conclusion of the work will occur with the presentation of a seminar, open to the entire academic community, as well as the subsequent publication, in Law Journals, of articles or expanded abstracts, authored by the participating students, containing the summary of their research work developed.

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
